



FIRE & Jeremiah 23:29

ave you noticed how partial we are to comfort these days? Today's new songs make us feel good. They are sweet and attractive, often based on comforting Scriptures. The Word should inspire our songs (Colossians 3:16). But that same Word has a sharp side. Where are contemporary choruses that warn about God's wrath? Where are the "hard savings"? They too reflect the God we adore.

Even from the Old Testament, we tend to select the "hope" passages. But the prophets delivered many stern messages, including this rhetorical question from the weeping prophet:

Is not My word like fire, declares the LORD, and like a hammer that breaks the rock in pieces? (Jeremiah 23:29).

In that context, fire burns and destroys. A hammer strikes with force, driving hard, smashing and pulverizing. When God's Word goes forth as fire and hammer, it wreaks just vengeance, which is also part of God's faithfulness to His promises. When we share God's Word as fire and hammer, we fulfill the spirit of Ezekiel 3:17: Whenever you hear a word from My mouth, you shall give them warning from Me. We let the Word fulfill its role which includes "rebuke" and "correction" (2 Timothy 3:16). Do we speak the whole truth like Paul?

I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all, for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God (Acts 20:26-27).

John the Baptizer's message was "Good News" (Luke 3:18) that included painful truths (Luke 3:17, 19). "Salvation" makes no sense without the problem it solves. Therefore, the healthy PLEASE NOUNT PROFESA 850 message exposes sin (Ephesians 5:11, 13; Luke 2:34-35; John 3:18-21 cf. Jeremiah 6:14).

Are you seeking the perfect balance of positives and negatives? Do you want the healthiest presentation of the Good News? Then use the Bible itself! It is "the whole counsel of God" within one cover.

Summer Campaigns

The American summer is a busy time for the Kingdom. Here are a few glimpses into World Bible School travels and activities.

'BS' John and Beth Reese led 18 "God Bless Africa" (GBA) campaigners to Zimbabwe. The group's ages ranged from 75 to 16 (two teens came from Tanzania, and Harding University sent four students with two professors). Zimbabwean Christians organized three WBS follow up seminars that drew over 500, with 47 baptized into Christ. Our internationals served in six congregations and blessed the orphans of Chivero Home of Hope, also conducting a VBS that attracted 200 local children.

WBS' Brian and Sondra Davis organized two campaigns for Hillcrest church of Christ in Abilene, TX. They first brought

six Americans to work with the staff and students of Zimbabwe's Mutare School of Preaching and Operation Starfish orphans feeding program. The five-year church plant at Chuware celebrated the opening of its building. With 320 people attending the Gospel meeting, 15 obeyed the Gospel. The second in Mumena, Zambia, brought 30 Americans (15 Hillcrest adults and 13 high school graduates, with two from

Westside church of Christ in Round Rock. TX, where Brian is an elder). Using WBS materials, God Has Spoken and Guide to New Testament Christianity, campaigners taught 320 students, ages 13 to 32, from 14 village congregations. Forty-four new Christians were baptized into Christ. Both Zimbabwe campaigns partnered with the Gospel Chariot.

WBS' Phil and Elaine Palmer spent a month in Kenya and Tanzania, conducting three WBS recruiting campaigns with 75 nationals. They enrolled 800 new WBS students. Two WBS Leaders Workshops prepared trainers for Recruiters Workshops aimed at equipping 400 church workers. WBS Service Centers were upgraded in Kenya and Uganda with new scanning and communications equipment. A WBS follow up seminar was held at Nairobi's Institute for Practical Christian Ministry. As Phil says, "Praise to God for the encouragement, growth and proclamation of the Gospel!"

Mathetis Launches in October!

Witness a dream coming to life at GMC 2019—**a social media discipling tool!**

Years ago, visionary leaders at World Bible School saw the need to engage newer generations spiritually via social media. The last 2 years have seen intensive investment and preparations. This brand-new social media discipling tool is called **Mathetis** (adapted from the Greek for "disciple"). Think of Mathetis as a social network that fosters spiritual growth among friends, small-groups, and individuals. It invites our world into a conversation filled with love and truth.

Mathetis offers a variety of online experiences that incorporate engaging videos, thought-provoking questions, interactive exercises, descriptive articles and meaningful discussions. Participants can access Mathetis on any device. They can enter at any topic—usually framed as a search-friendly question that they find interesting. These topics lead to encounters with the Good News of Jesus and life in His body.

Since this method is innovative, WBS has also developed a curriculum geared for your congregation's Bible classes and home study groups. This printed curriculum parallels the Mathetis online experiences. Each 13-lesson booklet is valuable as a stimulating Bible study. It also develops better understanding of youth cultures and trains those who want to enhance their outreach through Mathetis and social media.

The first unveiling of Mathetis is reserved for October 11th at GMC 2019. After mentors are recruited, Mathetis will begin to "go public" early in 2020. To receive exclusive access and

Big Events



Since 2006, InterMission has served missionaries on and off their respective fields. Veteran missionaries—Kent and Nancy Hartman, Clay and Cherry Hart, John and Beth Reese, and Edward and Sharon Short—form the core team of volunteers that promote mission productivity and longevity, with "safe landing" transitions. This year, they and six other facilitators conducted

the East Africa Intermission near Nairobi for over 80 cross-cultural workers with churches of Christ. Other InterMission activities include Global Reunion, a camp for missionary families, held at OCU in Edmond (160 registered), Re-Entry Workshops, consulting and congregational training.

The Important Things


The editorial (page 1) raises the question of balance in handling the Scriptures. God comes as a gentle dove and a consuming fire. His Word is life-giving rain and a heavy hammer. Each biblical tension is true and plays its vital role. The sacred responsibility to represent God's Word compels us to write World Bible School courses with utmost care—twelve years to develop the Master Series.

Some onlookers, seeing 1,400,000 new enrollments in 2018, might think that WBS is about large numbers. The far greater priority is faithfulness and fairness in presenting the Good News. An adapted message—such as a "health and wealth gospel"—would attract millions more. But what would be the point? Why promote a perversion that is powerless? Why dishonor the Giver of the Gospel, as if we are wiser for our age and better at engaging our culture? His way is right, perfectly suited to fulfill all His purposes. Our task is to share His way in love, well knowing that some will be attracted and some repelled (1 Corinthians 1:18-23). All disciples share the same task, as reflected by a recent shepherd's farewell at Jefferson City, Missouri.

How can one measure growth in a congregation using attendance, when the growth of the individual members is measured by the stature of Christ? I would challenge any expert on church growth to give us the budget or attendance at any of the seven churches in Revelation. No need to wonder why. Jesus was talking to the churches and individuals about the important things.

We strive to be the church of the first century, spiritually speaking, because we strive to follow God's Word as they strove to follow it—seeking to please the Lord by staying faithful to the Word of God. listening closely to the apostle's instruction and applying it to our hearts, encouraging each other in this, too, and constantly on guard against the influence of the world. If our hearts are fixed on a common goal, we shall reach it together. Let us put our confidence in His promises and to rejoice at His coming when we shall greet our eternal family both old and new in His presence.

This striving includes emphasizing the Lord's "weightier matters... without neglecting the others" (Matthew 23:23). We make no claim to human perfection, just the heart-felt confession that "Jesus is Lord" and His way is the only way.
