WHAT IS *Evangelism?*

IT HOLDS THE GREATEST GIFT!

For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, “But the righteous man shall live by faith” (Romans 1:16-17; NASB).

In the world where we see such need and human suffering, we often wonder what can make a difference. What power can change this world for the better?! In the verse above, the apostle Paul actually spoke of a “power” of this magnitude. Jesus Christ began his ministry with this power.

And Jesus was going about in all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every kind of disease and every kind of sickness among the people (Matthew 4:23; NASB).

As Jesus laid the foundation for the transition to His New Covenant, the Apostle Peter — on the day of Pentecost — preached the first Gospel sermon where he taught those willing to repent to be baptized for the remission of their sins. No development of the human condition can be sustained or make a significant difference without the reestablishment of our relationship

Do we believe in this “power”? Do we sense the urgency when Jesus invites us into this mission? He began with His apostles.

And He appointed twelve, that they might be with Him, and that He might send them out to preach, and to have authority to cast out the demons (Mark 3:14-15).

He continues with us.

And Jesus came and spoke unto them, saying, all power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.

Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen (Matthew 28:18-20).

What is evangelism? It is the sharing of the best news ever given to mankind! It is the means by which Jesus provides the best gift to us! It is the essential message of how we can become what we are created to be in this life and beyond! Brothers and sisters, if we believe in this “power” to transform mankind, we will be about our Father’s business and share the Gospel with every soul on this earth! 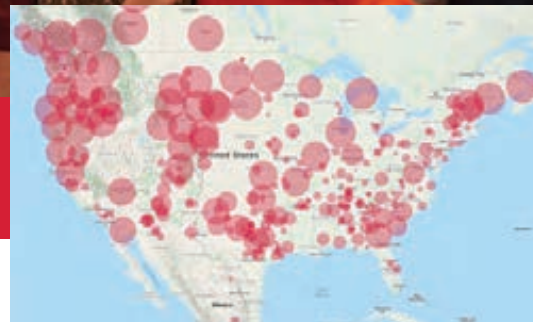

WHAT IF EVERY CONGREGATION STARTED A WBS TEACHING PROGRAM FOR THEIR MEMBERS TO PARTICIPATE IN?

- Currently, we have 80 Ocean Bridge congregations who are participating in a new method of Bible correspondence teaching using high-speed, two-way scanning rather than international postal systems in countries where postal systems are struggling. This year they are teaching 52,182 Students.
- The Highland Lakes church of Christ in Kingsland, Texas, recently visited the WBS offices in Austin to brainstorm ways to recruit more Ocean Bridge Students in Nigeria. Their Study Helper team is excited about their Ocean Bridge Students! Long-time Nigerian evangelist, Sylvester Imogoh, provided important feedback from the field as we brainstormed Student recruitment, Follow-up, curriculum and brotherhood participation. Sylvester became a Christian through WBS.

WHAT IF EVERY MEMBER OF THE CHURCH ADOPTED 20 STUDENTS FROM OUR ONLINE STUDENT BOARD?

- Currently over 700 members of the church are active as WBS Online Study Helpers. Yet we average 25,000 Students asking to study the Bible per month! Would you commit to adopting some of these Students?

WHAT IF EVERY CONGREGATION OFFERED WBS COURSES TO THEIR COMMUNITY?

- Currently, 607 churches use the WBS Connect program to offer studies with their community or communities where they want to evangelize!
- The College church of Christ in Searcy, Arkansas, is mailing a WBS introduction course to each address in their city with the offer of studying the Bible and discovering who Jesus is.



WHAT IF THE CONGREGATIONS OF THE LORD'S CHURCH WORKED TOGETHER TO SHARE JESUS WITH THE WORLD?

- Since 1973, we conservatively estimate that some 40 million Students have been registered to study through WBS. Realize that no congregation "reports" to WBS. We craft evangelism tools. Congregations decide how to use them. But with the reports that we have seen, we know that the Lord has used WBS, through you, to teach millions. When the brotherhood works together, the Lord can accomplish mighty things. When members of the church are engaged— the priesthood of all believers - in sharing their faith, then we can see how God takes our feeble efforts and multiplies them beyond what we can think or imagine!
- The Westchester church of Christ in New York state has used WBS tools for many years. In fact, their minister, Lewis Cooper, was a WBS Student in Trinidad.

THE PEARL OF GREAT PRICE IN THE PEARL OF AFRICA

Uganda is known as “The Pearl of Africa.” Sondra and I have wanted to visit the World Bible School work in Uganda for many years. This year, we finally were able to do so. Phil and Elaine Palmer, long-time missionary friends and WBS workers, had spoken of the great work that was going on there. Upon arrival, we were shown around the various WBS works by Duncan Ojiambo and Geoffrey Oguttu. Geoffrey¹⁵ is the WBS Service Center Coordinator, and Duncan¹⁶ is the director of the Gospel Chariot Ministry. Both of these men have helped to lead WBS efforts in Uganda for many years.

Seeing the Ocean Bridge Student graduations, witnessing their baptisms, participating in the chapel of Harding Christian Academy whose Students are registered for WBS courses, and visiting the Gospel Chariot Ministry in Jinja were inspiring events. While at the Gospel Chariot offices, however, the most inspiring event took place.

The men you see around this article are all volunteer evangelists who recruit Students and pursue Follow-up for WBS Students. Duncan had invited these men from all around the country to come and share their stories about WBS. Most of them had come to know Jesus and His Gospel through WBS. As they shared about their ministries, thousands of Students had been recruited over the years as WBS correspondence Students. Hundreds of baptisms were reported from the work just this year. And most importantly, many congregations of the Lord's church have been planted and are nurturing our WBS Students into the fullness of Christ!

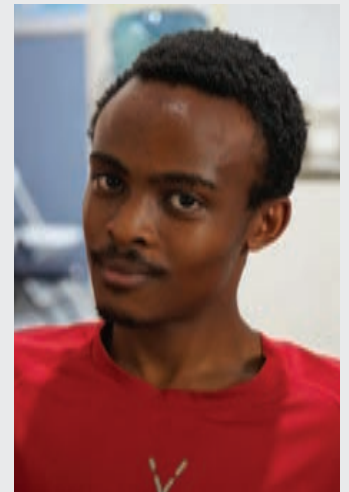


These are the unsung heroes of WBS! Behind each of these men is a faithful wife serving day in and day out to expand the kingdom of Christ. Some of these men shared of a time (in the past) where certain missionaries didn't like WBS courses being used. Yet these Ugandan evangelists had become Christians through WBS. They told of how, after some courses had been thrown away, they would go and retrieve the courses from the city dump and then hide the WBS courses under their beds. They would secretly continue to distribute them and provide Follow-up for those responding to the Gospel.

We are glad that these tensions no longer exist in Uganda, but we are most thankful for brave and faithful teachers of the Word who continue to partner with WBS through good times and bad to see that every soul in Uganda comes to know Jesus and His Gospel!

Called TO WORLD BIBLE SCHOOL

My journey to World Bible School likely began when I was a very young boy growing up in the small town of Martin, Tennessee, attending the church of Christ on Old Fulton Road. I come from a rich heritage of leaders in the Lord's church: My grandfather, R.F. Nunley, and my father, A.V. Nunley, along with several uncles and elder cousins led by the example of preaching, teaching and facilitating all aspects of worship services. However, even though I grew up with these faithful examples, I had a different ambition: I wanted to be an entertainer.

As soon as I was able, I moved to California to try my hand in the entertainment field — particularly stand-up comedy, as I'd hoped it would launch me into comedic movie roles. However, often in the midst of practicing my stand-up comedy routines, the routine would turn into a sermon, and I'd find myself preaching to myself. In retrospect, I believe GOD was using those years in stand-up comedy to polish me for the pulpit because HE clearly had other plans for me, though I didn't recognize it at the time.

After many years and failed attempts, I finally became frustrated with an acting career that was going nowhere, and when I confided this to my wife, Patricia, her response was, "I don't think GOD is going to give you what you want until you give HIM what HE wants." She was right.

When I finally surrendered to my calling, I reflected on the fact that my mentors had concentrated on preaching the Gospel and not so much "church" and "religion." Though church and religion are important, what they passed down to me was JESUS CHRIST and HIM crucified, and since becoming a full-time minister, I have concentrated on preaching the Gospel to a lost and dying world. In my position as pulpit minister for the Airport Freeway church

of Christ in Euless, Texas, I have been successful in spreading the Gospel; but, after 20 plus years in the pulpit, GOD has laid it on my heart to better *equip* my brothers and sisters to go into *their* worlds and share the Gospel themselves.

Then God sent George Barlow my way. George and I had worshipped together in California and have been very close friends over the years, but it was still a surprise when he invited me to be a part of World Bible School. His first instruction was simple but life-changing: "Take the courses yourself." I did and I was encouraged to see that the lessons were biblically sound, Christ-centered and so clearly written that even young Students could grasp them.

I thank GOD for WBS and its ability to spread HIS message of peace both in this country and across the seas. WBS helps the kingdom grow by equipping the citizens of the kingdom. We reference Matthew 28:18-20 as the Great Commission, but I heard a minister say the Great Commission is the Command Mission. GOD commands us to go and WBS equips us to go effectively.

WBS builds up the teacher as much as the Student, reminding us of GOD's love, HIS promises, and the security we have in Christ Jesus. The more I study the material, as a minister of GOD's word, the more assured and inspired I am to share it with others! What a gift!

World Bible School and I have the same motivation. We want to encourage, educate and empower the kingdom of GOD to spread HIS Word throughout the world and I am honored to be added to this task force; not only to teach, but also to help raise support so that countless more can hear the message of Christ. I love this work, and I love what God is doing through it!

THE MEASURE OF LIFE IS GIVING

Jesus' words in Luke 6:38 remind us of a divine principle that is both simple and profound. He said, *"Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, and running over. For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return."*

GIVING FAITH TO YOUR *children*

“FAITH DEVELOPMENT IS A JOURNEY ...”

As Christian parents, we are constantly balancing many responsibilities —work, family, extracurricular activities, and the list can go on. Amid these pressures, it’s essential to keep our personal relationship with God at the center of our lives. This means intentionally ensuring prayer, worship and studying God’s Word remains a priority, even when our schedules are busy. We can’t share our faith in God if it’s not truly there. By making our faith visible and active, we provide an example that our children can follow. As Paul shares with the church at Corinth in *1 Corinthians 11:1*, “*Follow me as I follow Christ.*” As we follow Christ as parents, we show our children that our relationship

with God is not just a tradition but a faith-led way of life. Personally, my wife and I have adopted a variety of approaches as we continue to share our faith with our daughters, Faith (14) and Olivia (12). Sharing Bible stories and showing up at the church building is important, but integrating spiritual conversations into everyday life has been impactful with our faith-sharing process. We regularly discuss God’s presence in our joys and struggles, we pray together and we’re being honest about our own faith journeys. When children see faith woven into daily routines, it becomes real and relevant to them, helping them understand that God is present in every aspect of our lives.

STUDYING GOD’S WORD TOGETHER

Regular study of Scripture as a family is foundational. This can take the form of daily devotionals, reading Bible passages that are relevant to what our children are experiencing or exploring questions together. *Deuteronomy 6:7* instructs us to teach God’s Word diligently to our children, making faith conversations a natural part of our routines — whether at the dinner table, during car rides or before bedtime. Encouraging children to ask questions and share their thoughts helps them engage with Scripture personally and allows parents to gauge where they are spiritually.



MENTOR SUPPORT AND SPIRITUAL COMMUNITY

Connecting our children with other Christians is powerful. We intentionally seek spiritual mentors and encourage our daughters to participate in church activities and youth groups. Hearing about God's work from others broadens their perspective and reinforces what we teach at home. Paul's words in *1 Thessalonians 5:11* remind us to "encourage one another and build one another up," highlighting the importance of community in spiritual growth.

ENGAGEMENT IN THE LORD'S WORK

Allowing our daughters to engage in the Lord's work alongside us has also been a key part of the faith-sharing process. Even when our daughters were toddlers, we would visit church members as a family. We would visit nursing homes together as a family. We would find opportunities to serve together as a family. This allowed our daughters to experience God for themselves.

A few months ago, our family had the opportunity to travel to Mumena, Zambia, to participate in a World Bible School Follow-up campaign. My daughters had never been outside of the United States and they had never been on a mission campaign, but we thought as a family, it would be a faith-building challenge and a great opportunity for our daughters to experience God on a deeper level.



My wife and I had spent years sharing our faith, and we experienced the power of God as we witnessed our daughters now sharing their faith. Our daughters had the opportunity to meet and teach other young girls, and that is exactly what they did. Our daughters learned about a beautiful new culture, and more importantly they learned more about God and His Word. They harnessed their own faith and knowledge of God's Word and they shared it in their own words. They learned how to trust God for themselves. It was even more surprising that our daughters were ready to go back to Zambia once we returned to the United States. They made friends and had more to teach about God's Word.

Faith development is a journey, not a one-time event. It requires patience, prayer and trust in God's timing. As parents we must be willing to let children ask questions, wrestle with doubts and discover their own relationship with God. By consistently studying Scripture, surrounding them with godly mentors and engaging in service together, parents lay a strong foundation for their children to build their own faith.

Building a Christian Marriage and Family BY THE ALLISONS | MISSIONARIES SPECIALIZING IN MARRIAGE & FAMILY

Veteran missionaries Fielden and Janet Allison bring unique qualities to World Bible School's newest course, "Building a Christian Marriage and Family." Their African mission work began in 1972. After Idi Amin expelled them from Uganda, they and their team planted 120 churches among the Kipsigis of Kenya (1973-1990). They then worked in the Sabao language of Mount Elgon, nurturing churches, training church leaders and establishing Christian schools (1990-2006).

The Allisons firmly believe in God's plan for marriage and the family. Their field experiences revealed urgent needs in this area. They prepared educationally, including a master's degree in Marriage and Family Therapy (Harding University), then founded the African Institute of Marriage and Family in 2006. From their base in Tanzania, and recently Crowley's Ridge College in Arkansas, they have travelled continually in some 20 African countries to bless leaders and learners with stronger marriages (2006-present). This wealth of experience, teaching, counseling and publishing now culminates in "Building a Christian Marriage and Family," especially written for WBS.

The course's initial publication is on the WBS Library (wbslibrary.org). Its thirteen lessons are ideal for classes and groups, as well as individual learners. Topics include "Choosing a Mate," "Communication," "Conflict Resolution," "Roles," "One Body," "Forgiveness," "Money Matters," "Family," "Discipline" and more. You will want to benefit yourself, your group and your Students with this unique resource into which the Allisons have poured their lives and their love.

EPHESIANS COMMENTARY

Following the release of Basic English Commentaries for Matthew, Acts and Romans, WBS is happy to introduce the commentary for the New Testament book of Ephesians.

Written by missionary Van Tate as a complement to the Simple English Bible translation and edited by Brian Rex Davis, the introduction to Ephesians states, in part, "The author wrote this book to show the relationship between Christ and the church. Paul wanted the readers to understand that God planned for the church from the beginning ... Ephesians shows how Christians are to live. The first three chapters emphasize what it means to be in Christ. The last three chapters show how we are to live because we are in Christ."

WBS Commentary in Basic English is edited and compiled using the following perspectives.

1. The Bible is the complete and inspired Word of God.
2. The Bible establishes the New Testament as the Christian's only rule of faith under the Kingship of Christ.
3. The Bible preserves the pattern of New Testament Christianity for all ages as Christ desires for the unity of His Body, the church.

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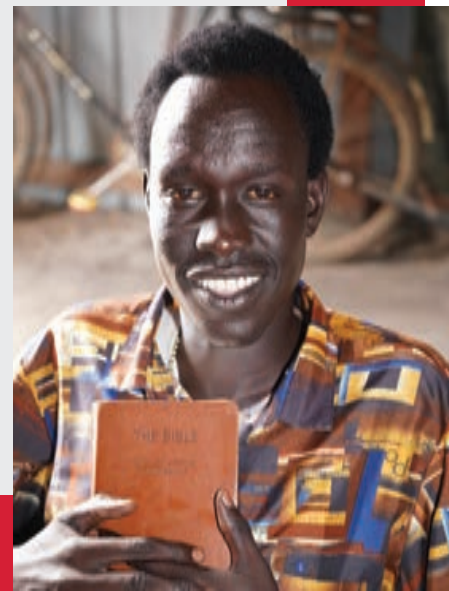
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
